Course Description: ICS-300 is a command level course that provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced knowledge and application of the ICS to complex incidents. This course expands upon information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. *Course participants will receive a FEMA Certificate upon successful completion.* FEMA Student ID Number is required to take this course. <https://cdp.dhs.gov/FEMASID>

Prerequisites:

Required - IS 100, 200, 700, & 800
Recommended- 2+ years of field experience

Target Audience:

City/County employees, First Responders, Law Enforcement, Fire Fighters, Public Works, Public Health, Emergency Management, IMT Team personnel, and any individuals assigned to work in the Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

Course Objectives:

- Describe how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents.
- Describe the incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Implement the incident management process on a simulated expanding incident.
- Develop an Incident Action Plan for a simulated incident.
