Intermediate ICS-300 for Expanding Incidents

21.00 Hours

Course Description: Enhance your Incident Command skills, with a special focus on new concepts of the Incident Command System (ICS). The training and resources provided in this course will assist personnel who require advanced application of the ICS. The course will also benefit any person who has a responsibility to function in an Incident command post or an EOC position managing an expanding incident.

You will participate in group activities that introduce the development of the Incident Action Plan (IAP) and demonstrate the interactions between the Command and General Staff sections of the ICS.

Date/Time: April 29 – May 1, 2025, 8:00 am - 5:00 pm daily

Topics

- How the National Incident Management System (NIMS) Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents
- The incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Implementing the incident management process at a simulated incident.
- Developing an Incident Action Plan (IAP) for a simulated incident.

Target Audience: Personnel expected to perform in a management capacity in an expanding incident that may require a higher level of NIMS/ICS training from the following disciplines/services:

- Fire Service
- Emergency Medical Services (EMS)
- Hazardous Materials (HazMat)
- Law Enforcement (LE)
- Public Health (PH)
- Public Works (PW)
- Emergency Management (EM)
- Government administrative
- Private sector and military
- County, state, and federal agency personnel who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents or Type 3 incidents.

Obtain a FEMA Student Identification Number

- **Federal Student Identification (SID) is required for each student.** DHS/FEMA has directed the implementation of the Federal SID for all HSNTF granted funded participants. If you have attended a federal training in the past 18-24 months you may already have SID #; if so select the option “Forgot Your FEMA SID?”.
- **The procedure for obtaining a SID number:**
 1. To register, go to <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid>
 2. Click on the "Register for a FEMA SID" button near the top the screen.
 3. Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account.
 4. You will receive an email with your SID number. You should save this number in a secure location.
